**Executive Summary:**

In accordance with *section 170 (3) and (4) of the Local Government Regulation 2012 (Regs)*, Council may by resolution, amend the budget for a financial year at any time before the end of the financial year. The budget must continue to comply with *section 169 of the Local Government Regulation 2012* in order for the amendment to take effect.

In accordance with the above sections an amended 2023-2024 Budget is presented for Council's consideration.

**Background:**

*The capital works budget has decreased by \$4,307,429.00. This is largely due to the decrease to projects which span over financial years and just reflecting the dollars that is anticipated to be expended in this financial year.*

**Significant amendments to the 2023/24 capital works budget are:**

- DRFA 2023 – increase \$1,000,000
- DRFA 2024 – new \$350,000
- Community Children’s Hub – decrease \$5,246,784
- Council Housing Projects – decreased by \$1,050,000
